



INTERNATIONAL REQUIREMENT

- In order to graduate from the Faculty of Law at the University of Calgary, all LLB/JD students must complete an “international requirement” during their second *or* third year.
- There are alternative ways of fulfilling this requirement.
- The first way is by satisfactorily completing (C– or better) at least one course from the following list:
 - Commercial Arbitration Law
 - Conflict of Laws
 - International Development Law
 - International Environmental Law
 - International Human Rights & Humanitarian Law
 - International Investment Law
 - International Law
 - International Petroleum Transactions
 - International Tax
 - International Trade Law
 - Jessup International Moot
- The second way is by satisfactorily completing a “Study Abroad”, either during a spring or summer term or the fall term of your third year, if approved in advance by the Associate Dean.
