

Requirements for Graduation

Students are eligible to graduate if they meet the following requirements:

1. Successful completion of all compulsory first year courses. Students must obtain a C- or above or a CR in the following courses:
 - Law 400: Constitutional Law
 - Law 402: Contract Law
 - Law 403: Legislation
 - Law 404: Property Law
 - Law 406: Tort Law
 - Law 407: Foundations in Law & Justice I
 - Law 408: Foundations in Law & Justice II
 - Law 410: Crime: Law & Procedure

2. Successful completion (C- or above or CR) of the following compulsory upper year courses:
 - Law 503: Administrative Law
 - Law 505: Civil Procedure
 - Law 507: Evidence
 - Law 508: Negotiations
 - Law 510: Ethical Lawyering
 - Law 602: Advocacy

3. A total of **31 credits** (including mandatory and optional courses) satisfactorily completed in each of the second and third years of full-time study.

4. Successful completion (C- or above) of the following requirements:
 - Upper Year Writing Requirement
 - Theoretical Requirement
 - International Requirement
