INTERNATIONAL REQUIREMENT

- In order to graduate from the Faculty of Law at the University of Calgary, all JD students must complete an “International Requirement” during their second or third year.
- The International Requirement may be fulfilled by one of the following two options:
 1. By satisfactorily completing and achieving a grade of C– or better, in at least one of the following courses:
 - Law 536: International Criminal Law
 - Law 549: International Law
 - Law 557: Commercial Arbitration
 - Law 597: International Trade Law
 - Law 613: Conflict of Laws
 - Law 627: International Environmental Law
 - Law 628: International Investment Law
 - Law 630: International Petroleum Transactions
 - Law 631: International Tax Law
 - Law 673: Jessup Moot
 - Law 693.xx: Law of the Sea
 - Law 693.xx: Introduction to US Legal System
 - Law 693.xx: International Business Negotiation

2. By satisfactorily completing a “Study Abroad,” International Exchange program, during a spring or summer term or during the fall term of the student’s third year, if approved in advance by the Associate Dean.

Upon completion of the International Requirement, the student shall provide a Written Declaration indicating that the Requirement has been met and setting out which course or option was used to meet the Requirement and the semester in which it was completed.

Failure to provide the Written Declaration in a timely manner may preclude the student from graduating. It is the student’s responsibility to ensure the Written Declaration is submitted to the Assistant Dean, Student Services upon completion of the International Requirement.
